



## DOGS LISTED AS DANGEROUS BREEDS

To obtain a licence to keep dogs that are listed as dangerous breeds you need to go to your Town Hall to get the application form.

Requirements:

- Valid ID (passport) and Residency Certificate if you have it.
- To be at least 18
- Certificate that confirms you are physically and psychologically fit (you obtain this from the same medical centers that perform the tests for renewing driving licences 'centro de reconocimiento de conductores'), certificate not older than 1 year.
- Proof of having contracted public liability insurance. Check for the required amount of cover in Andalucía it is 175.000 euros but it varies per region. If you have house insurance that includes dogs in the public liability cover that will do as well.
- Certificate confirming you have no criminal record of violence. Certificado de Antecedentes Penales.

The licence costs around 35 euros and according to the Real Decree 287/2002 of March 22, it should be valid for 5 years, but several local ordenanzas mention that they must be renewed yearly. The licence or at least the stamped application form must be in place before puppies can be chipped or vaccinated against rabies by the vet.
