



HOW TO GET A FULL VEHICLE REPORT FROM THE DGT

Before buying a second-hand vehicle, you might want to check if there are any outstanding fines, unpaid taxes, embargoes or other restrictions on the vehicle you plan to buy.

Should you buy it without checking, there is a risk that you as the new owner take over all the possible debts, because they will be transferred with the change of ownership.

If you have a digital certificate, you can do it from home using this link: <https://sede.dgt.gob.es/es/tramites-y-multas/tu-coche/informe-de-vehiculo/>

You can pay the fee of 8,20 Euros with credit card, debit card or by direct debit from your bank account, however the owner of the credit card/debit account must be identical to the owner of the digital certificate, the same applies for direct debit.

In case you do not have a Digital Certificate, you can go to your nearest Jefatura de Trafico, fill out the form from this link and pay the fee of 8,20 Euros in cash. Don't forget to bring your documentation.
